This week we presented 2 Baby Talk Academys (BTA) parenting education courses designed to provide information and support to parents of infants and toddlers about how to provide the nurturing, structure and guidance to develop: fostering strong parent-child relationships, supporting children's optimum development, enhancing school readiness skills, strengthening children, families and community.

We also presented 2 of the Baby Hours which are opportunities to commune with parents and caregivers live for an hour, with upcoming sessions on infants and toddlers designed for all -- and a few sessions for special audience. This week's Baby Hour provided information, and connection to parents of infants presented by Maureen Griner, LMHC..

Client Story*

During the Baby Hour this week a teen mother presented with soome concerns for her infants crying and distress. During this session we discussed how babies feel our stress as parents and often cry when we are in fact tense or stressed. We discussed ways to relax ourselves before reponding to our infants to ensure that our comfort and connection is felt as positive and co-regulating for the baby. We discussed self- care as a means of care not only for ourselves but also for our babies. This mother expressed great relief after she participated in a discussion on how infants will be more easily calmed if we take a moment to calm ourselve before we interact with them. This new and young mother expressed gratitude in being about to talk about her stress and her babies reaction to it.
